



Palmer Wildlife Management Area

Palmer, Warren 1,017 Acres

SIZE:	1,017 acres. The terrain is mostly hilly and moderately sloped, but there is a considerable amount of relatively level land in the central and northeastern sections of the area.
U.S.G.S. QUAD:	Palmer
VEGETATION:	This property is composed primarily of wooded uplands dominated by transitional hardwoods that have overtaken old abandoned fields. A few dozen acres of open habitat are maintained in the central and northeastern sections of the area.
WATER:	Two man-made ponds are located near the center of the property, but both are small and fairly shallow. The upper pond supports a nominal largemouth bass population and related warm-water fishery. Both ponds are stocked in the early spring to provide some very limited trout action.
WILDLIFE:	Woodcock, deer, gray squirrel, rabbit, raccoon, waterfowl and numerous non-game species. This area is presently NOT stocked with pheasant.
